The aim of the project is to assess and improve the viability and landscape connectivity of African wild dog populations nationally and across the Kavango-Zambesi Transfrontier Conservation Area. We seek to obtain information on (i) movement patterns and habitat use during dispersal, (ii) long-distance and transboundary dispersal events, (iii) survival and reproductive success of resident and dispersing individuals, (iv) abundance estimates for the entire ecosystem. This information is crucial to assess population viability and extinction risks under changing environmental and anthropogenic scenarios and to inform management plans to conserve this highly endangered species. Pictures from YOUR SIGHTINGS are fundamental to help us follow the fates and whereabouts of individual wild dogs across the ecosystem.
